2011 American Gold Eagle Uncirculated Coin Released by US Mint

On May 5, 2011, the United States Mint began sales of the 2011 American Gold Eagle Uncirculated Coin. This is a special collector version of the popular bullion coin.

The obverse design is taken from the Saint Gaudens Double Eagle. The reverse of the coin



was designed by Miley Busiek and features a male eagle carrying an olive branch to a nest containing a female eagle and hatchlings. Each 2011-W Uncirculated Gold Eagle is struck in 22 karat gold and contains one troy ounce of gold content. There is no maximum mintage or household ordering limits in place. Pricing is based on the average market price of gold.
